From grief to beauty: Local artist turns loss into flower preservation legacy

After more than two and a half years of preserving cherished memories from her home studio, Kerry Nicklaus, owner of Rememberable Resin, is opening her first brick-and-mortar location, bringing her unique flower preservation art to a larger stage.

Nicklaus, a longtime resident of Howard-Suamico started Rememberable Resin in 2023 after facing one of life's most difficult moments — the unexpected loss of her mother. "After my mom's passing, I had such a hard time letting go of the flowers from her memorial service," Nicklaus shared. "I wanted to find a way to preserve them, to keep a piece of her with me. That's how this all began."

What started as a deeply personal project has now grown into a business that receives flowers shipped from clients across the United States. From wedding bouquets to memorial arrangements, Nicklaus carefully preserves each bloom in resin or pressed displays, turning

them into lasting keepsakes that capture life's most meaningful moments.

"I never imagined how far this would reach," Nicklaus said. "People from all over the country trust me with their flowers. Every order is so personal — it's not just a product, it's their story, their memories."

After working out of her home for over two years, Nicklaus made the decision to open a dedicated storefront. The new shop, located at 13382 Velp Ave Suite C in Suamico, will allow her to meet with clients in person, display her creations, and streamline the flower drop-off and pick-up process.

"This shop represents a huge step for me — going from a home-based business to a professional studio," she said. "It's been a journey filled with heart, and I'm excited to create a space where the community can see, feel, and experience what Rememberable Resin is all about."

Should you trust a ‘finfluencer’?

In the age of social media, it's easy to find advice on just about anything — including how to manage your money. Content creators known as “finfluencers” — short for financial influencers — use platforms like TikTok, YouTube and Instagram to share their takes on investing, budgeting and building wealth. Many of them are charismatic and relatable, and they often speak from personal experience. But while their content may be engaging, taking financial advice from a finfluencer without digging deeper can come with significant risks.

While some finfluencers may have formal training or credentials, many do not. Instead, their influence stems

from their popularity rather than professional experience. But popular advice may not necessarily be good advice. A 2023 study by the Swiss Finance Institute even found that unskilled finfluencers typically have larger followings than skilled ones.

Why be cautious?

For young or new investors, social media can make finance feel accessible. In fact, a 2022 FINRA study says that more than 60% of Americans younger than 35 get investing information from these platforms. But social media isn't regulated the same way traditional financial advising is, so anyone, qualified or not, can offer financial tips.

Unlike traditional financial advisors, finfluencers don't know your unique goals, financial situation or risk tolerance. And likely, they're not

licensed (you can check here: Check Out Your Investment Professional | Investor.gov). Even well-meaning guidance might lead you down a risky path if it's not tailored to your needs. And unfortunately, some finfluencers have exploited the trust they build with followers to promote questionable investments or outright frauds.

Warning signs to watch for

Here are a few signs that a finfluencer's advice may be worth avoiding:

- **Unrealistic “get-rich” promises:** Claims like, “Turn \$500 into \$50,000 in a year,” are highly improbable and may indicate a scam.
- **Hurry, hurry:** Be wary of advice that pressures you to act fast or plays on fear of missing out. Important financial decisions shouldn't come with a countdown clock.

- **Flashy displays of wealth:** Images of luxury cars, watches or cash can be more about generating views than offering sound advice. If a finfluencer is trying that hard to convince you to take an action, it often means they will profit — perhaps they'll get paid to promote a product or service, or earn a fee for referring you, or are trying to boost clicks and followers to earn more.

What you can do

- **Do your own homework.** Don't take finfluencers' advice at face value. Cross-check it with reliable sources. The finfluencer may even be under investigation by a federal or state securities regulator. Talking to a licensed financial advisor you trust can help you discern good advice from the bad.
- **Recognize conflicts of in-**

terest. If a finfluencer promotes a product or service, find out if they're being paid to do so. And remember, online personalities make money by generating high viewership, not because their advice has a track record of success.

- **Use common sense.** When something sounds too good to be true, it usually is. And of course, never disclose your bank or brokerage account numbers to a finfluencer, and never send money.

Finfluencers can make financial topics more engaging and accessible. But when it comes to your money, a social media video from someone who doesn't know you is no substitute for informed, personalized guidance. Take the time to verify, research and, when in doubt, seek advice from a professional.

Board endorses pre-referendum exploration process

HSSD is exploring possibilities to go to referendum in 2026, including the reinvestment of the operational referendum and a facilities referendum, which would cover phase two of our long-range facilities plan. On April 7, 2025, the Board endorsed HSSD to proceed with a pre-referendum exploration process.

In the fall, community engagement and option prioritization will take place. No decisions have been made at this time about potential referendum questions or when

they might be presented to the community in 2026. We have two major election opportunities - the Spring General Election in April or the Fall General Election in November.

Facilities Assessment Results

After the April 7 Board meeting, HSSD completed a facilities assessment. Below are key findings from the Facilities Assessment. The full report can be found on our website.

- Bay Port and Meadow-

brook exceed functional capacity.

- Several schools are approaching capacity limits.
- Utilization at Bay Port is near 80% optimal target (80% is the threshold).
- Undersized career and technical education (CTE) spaces and science labs at Bay Port.
- Undersized classrooms in multiple schools.
- Lack of breakout or collaboration spaces in multiple schools.
- Safety and/or circulation challenges in older build-

ings.

Where Are We Now?

During the summer, the Core team met 1-2 times per month. The Core Team consists of a Board representative, key district administrators, and architects from EUA. So far this summer, the Core Team has identified, explored, and/or developed:

- Potential phase two facilities options
- Enrollment and enrollment projection reports and data

- HSSD's operational budget
- State budget impact
- A comprehensive plan for community engagement

Find the best ways to pay down debt

Are you concerned about debt? It's important to recognize this, but, at the same time, you may have more ways of gaining control of your debt situation than you had realized.

To begin with, not all debts are bad — after all, your mortgage provides you with a place to live, a car loan provides transportation, and student loans may have helped you get the career you wanted. In fact, the wise use of debt can be a key part of your overall financial strategy.

Nonetheless, if you're worried about what you owe, you've certainly got company. Nearly 60% of Americans say they are struggling with debt, according to a recent study by WalletHub, an online personal finance site.

How can you ease these struggles? It may help to follow these steps:

- **Know your debt.** Create a list that includes your mortgage, auto loans, student loans, medical debt, credit card debt and any installment purchases you've made. Then, add up the total amount you owe and calculate your debt-to-income ratio by dividing your total monthly

debt payments by your gross monthly income. (For revolving debt, such as credit cards, use the minimum payments in this calculation.) Ideally, you'd like to have a debt-to-income ratio below 35% if you have a mortgage, or 20% if you don't.

- **Look for restructuring opportunities.** By restructuring debt, you may be able to pay it down more quickly. You can do this by refinancing debts, perhaps by transferring credit card debt to a new card with a low introductory rate or by replacing your mortgage or auto loan with one that carries a lower rate. You might also consider swapping debts, possibly by using secured debt, such as a home equity loan or securities-based lending, to pay off higher-rate unsecured loans. Or you could consolidate debt by using secured debt to pay off several high-interest debts or transferring multiple credit card debts into one new card with a lower rate and minimal transfer fees.

- **Determine how much money will go to debt payments.** You do have some latitude as to how much money you'll devote to paying debts each month. To avoid incurring late fees or other penalties, you'll need to make the minimum payments, which means a flat

amount for some loans, such as your mortgage, and a percentage of the outstanding balance on other debts, especially your credit cards. After you've paid the minimum, though, you can choose to pay more, which can shorten the life of the debt and reduce total interest charges, or you can use the money for other goals, such as saving for your retirement or your children's education.

- **Prioritize your debts.** If you can make extra payments on your debts, it's helpful to prioritize them. You could choose the "avalanche" method by paying the debt with the highest interest rate first, or you could instead follow the "snowball" method by first tackling the debt with the lowest balance. The avalanche technique can help you minimize interest payments, while the snowball approach can give you a psychological boost by reducing the overall number of debts you're carrying, although it could result in your paying more interest over time.

Debt may be a fact of life — but if you manage it wisely, life can be a lot less stressful.
